Recently, a friend said to me that we are not a praying church. That really pushed the conviction button in my heart and so I'm purposing to focus on prayer this year.

Oswald Chambers said, "Prayer is the way that the life of God in us is nourished. We look upon prayer simply as a means of getting things for our-

selves, but the biblical purpose of prayer is that we may get to know God Himself." How often do we think of the life of God in us as we go through our daily routine? And, that it needs to be nourished! Chambers says that prayer is "a matter of working miracles in a person's inner nature." The Bible says we have a new nature and that nature (Gal.2:20) (Col.3:9-10), "the life of God in us," according

to Chambers, is either starved or nourished by prayer.

Tim Keller writes, "to reinvigorate my prayer life." "...to reawaken the intimacy with God." That is what prayer is all about! In Psalm 27, Keller says that David's "devotional life is more than only the study of the Bible and then prayer for the strength to practice it. David's meditation is deeply mystical. 'One thing ... I seek: ... to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord.' (Psalm 27:4). He is looking for a transformation of the affections of his heart as he prays."

That's what I want in my heart as well. I hope you will join me in pursuing God more intimately in prayer this year.
