

Psalm 23

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.

² He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters.

³ He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake.

⁴ Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,

I will fear no evil; For You *are* with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.

⁵ You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies;

You anoint my head with oil; My cup runs over.

I've been thinking about prayer and shepherding recently and especially David's prayer in Psalm 23. Whether as an Elder focusing on Disciples making Disciples or counseling couples, I've thought about shepherding God's flock. What does that mean? How do I really care for my sheep? What is it I really want for them? If you know anything about sheep, sometimes it can be like


herding cats! But, herding is the wrong word describing shepherding. Sheep are not like cattle, they cannot be herded; they must be led! How? I think of Col.3:12 "Since God called you to be the holy people He loves, you must clothe yourselves with tenderhearted mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." This, I believe, is God's prescription for shepherding His people. So, as I pray about my role in caring for those entrusted to my care, I want the "Good Shepherd" to be my guide.

Lord, thank you that you are April 2023 my shepherd and that you have called me to come alongside to help you in this task. Thank you that I'm not alone and that you have equipped me with everything I need to serve you. Oh how peaceful and restful it is to be led by you to places of lush fulfillment where I and your flock can dine on your word. Will you show me how to lead your flock there, to that quiet place.

Lord, so many of your flock are experiencing turbulent waters right now, health issues, financial stress, parent child problems. Will you help me to

lead them to your still waters where they can be refreshed by your name; body, soul and spirit, and their thirst quenched by your living water. Lord, some are facing the dark valley of death and it's so easy to fear what we have never experienced before. Lord, thank you for your promise to go with them moment by moment through the trial, comforting them. Thank you Lord, that no matter what may come, you are always providing abundant life, supplying overflowing grace above and beyond all we could ask or think. Thank you for being a merciful, good, good Father, where we will always be safe in your strong and loving arms.

I think of a couple we helped recently, coming out of a conservative and legalistic background. We led them emotionally and spiritually to a safe place where Jesus was, to feel at ease and loved in a way they hadn't experienced before. They opened their hearts to us, the Lord and each other which led to finding true emotional/spiritual healing and a more intimate relationship with The Gentle Shepherd.
